- 1. Optimum green spread in the Campus:** The college campus is situated amidst nature and within the campus the same is maintained by periodic plantation drives by students and other stake holders. The greenery in the college campus is a symbol of serenity and peace.
- 2. Clean campus:** Instructions are issued to all stake holders including students, teaching, non-teaching staff, parents etc. to keep the college campus clean at all times and related quotes are displayed at conspicuous places in the campus.
- 3. Solid waste management:** the college is committed towards focusing on reduction in waste generation. The solid waste is segregated as biodegradable and non-biodegradable and waste bins are provided accordingly. Waste bins are strategically located so that 100% waste is collected and the campus remains waste free and litter all the time.
- 4. E-waste management:** Digitization and smart technologies employed in education mandates collection of hardware and regular updation of the same. The college maintains all the equipment at optimum conditions through AMCs to increase the longevity of the use of hardware and decrease load on intangible resources. The hardware e-waste is periodically deposited in proper market place available for the same. Certain obsolete material is scrapped and discarded accordingly.
- 5. Liquid waste management:** Waste water from drinking water sources like RO system, water coolers, etc. is reused for cleaning, sweeping etc. Posters on water preservation are displayed at various places in the campus to create awareness about preserving water.
- 6. Bio-medical waste:** There is no biomedical waste generated in the College.
- 7. Waterbodies and their maintenance:** Within the campus two borewells are installed as follows
2HP, 350 ft. deep — 24 hrs. water availability.
1.5HP, 200 ft. deep----- 24 hrs. water availability.
Students are encouraged to use this water judiciously and minimize water wastage. There are 4 RO purifier along with rainwater harvesting system and ground water storage system.
- 8. Water conservation:** Rain water harvesting is employed to renew ground water level and to minimize use of other limited source of water. There are adequate trees in the campus that keep the water content in the soil at optimum level and prevents depletion of water bodies.
- 8. Efficient use of energy with contribution from renewable sources:** Solar energy panale from SUN group are installed. Approximately 12KWH per day energy is generated depending upon the sunshine. Excess energy produced is transferred to MSEDCL.
- 9. Restriction use of automobiles:** Automobile's parking area is outside the campus nearby the gate and all including teachers and students are encouraged to use ecofriendly modes of transportation. Use of electric motor vehicles and bicycles are encouraged.




